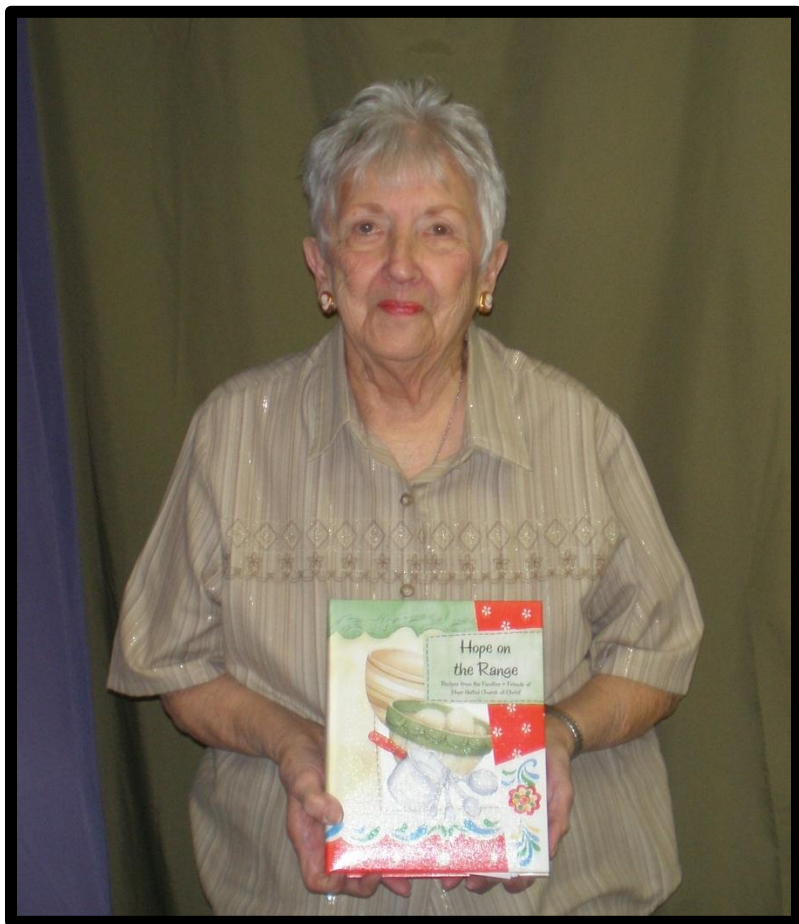

Please consider signing up for a chance to adopt a plot at Hope and show off your gardening skills! Winners of the plots will be drawn on January 22, at the annual meeting.

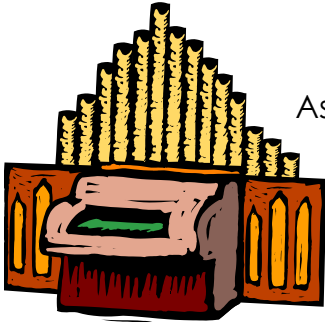
We have included photos here, so that you can see what these spaces look like now. And you can also begin dreaming about what you would do with the space should you adopt it!



Worship and Music Committee

A new line item has been added by council to our designated giving - the organ fund. Mindy was asked to write up a little about the history and condition of our current one. Thank you Mindy for doing that. Here it is:

The upper octaves on the upper keyboard are weak sounding, probably because of previous work done on it. Some of the pedal stops do not play. The speakers make a hissing noise, noticeable to the liturgists who have to sit next to the speakers. The person who recently looked at the organ said that, despite the hissing, the speaker system is still in very good shape. These problems have led to a lessened capability of the organ. I have had to re-write music, and get very "creative" in working around these issues. We have had this organ since 1993, and its exact age is unknown. I can say, with certainty that it has reached the end of its life span. Every Sunday that we have it, even with its problems, is a blessing and we have been very lucky that it has worked this long.



As far as what we purchase to replace this organ, my opinion is that it is time Hope UCC purchase a new organ, from a good, established organ company such as Allen or Rogers, with full warranties. It should have similar capabilities to the one we have, maybe a little better, and it should be midi-compatible with the capability of storing hymns that can be played at the touch of a button. Sure, a keyboard such as a Clavinova would serve, but if we are to continue with our growing wedding ministry, a full church organ is preferred. The congregation is used to having a church organ, and several members have told me that they miss organ music when I'm away for vacations.

I have served Hope UCC as organist since 1992, and for 18 years, have played this particular organ. The blessings I've received in the past 18 years number in the stars. It is time Hope UCC consider a new organ to serve a growing, active church, an instrument we can be proud of.

I would like to thank the Women's Fellowship for their generosity by designating the new cookbook profits go into a fund to purchase a new organ.

Mission Moments

Mission One: No, we did not travel to outer space to be a part of this project. However, Hope UCC did connect with many other UCC churches to collect over 1 million items of food. How awesome is that?

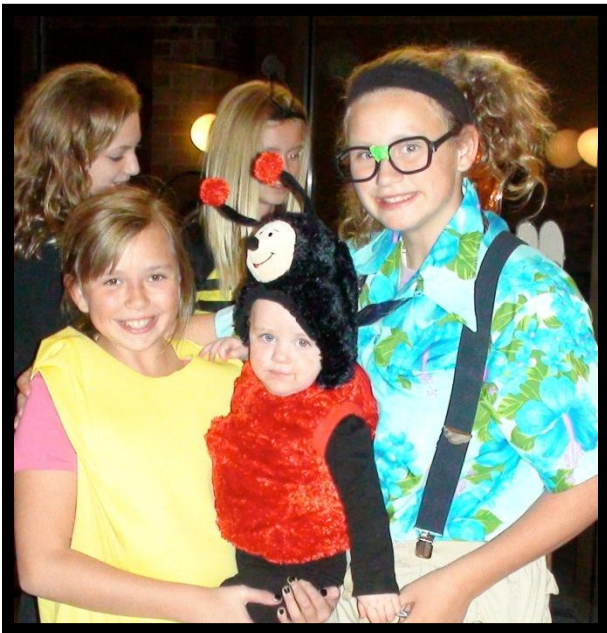
