From the Pastor...

Dear Friends and Family of Hope UCC,

Rupertus Meldenius said something like: "In the essentials we need unity; in the non-essentials we need freedom; but in all things we need love." What does living this mean for Hope UCC?

Reflecting on our time together, change being a constant companion, I want to share and describe this stage of our journey as self-study. We are embarking on a time to explore, look at ourself, gather data and begin describing what we experience. In July I will introduce a congregational conversation time after worship ([July 10](#)). The more people that participate the more accurate understanding we can communicate with prospective candidates. It will be a time we can share around one topic and learn or reaffirm healthy communication practices. We are going to begin with sharing our hopes for Hope... our dreams. Transition times are key times in the natural process of self-renewal. That is true in our own lives as well as in our church life. Sharing with each other is an essential (unity), what we share (non-essential), how we share it (essential) ... but in all of it ... Love be present. May we come to this event prepared to listen and prepared to share.

Alvin Toffler wrote in *Future Shock*, "Change is avalanching upon our heads and most people are grotesquely unprepared to cope with it." I read that back in 1976 and the book was already 6 years old. It is an understatement, including for the church. The in-betweenness is often times very uncomfortable. Yet stop and think of the changes in your lifetime. The Avalanche of Change in our world [today](#) does raise the question, how am I coping. At no other time has change been this rapid in many areas of our life. Like individuals, churches have their own rhythm and transitions, their own coping skills and patterns. I would like to help prepare Hope for these changes. "Throughout nature, growth involves periodic accelerations and transformations: Things go slowly for a time and nothing seems to change - until suddenly the eggshell cracks, the branch blossoms, the tadpole's tail shrinks away, the leaf falls, the bird molts, the hibernation begins. With us it is the same." (*Transitions: Making Sense of Life's Changes*, p.5)

Many of you have commented how much you are enjoying worship and changing things up a bit, and I have heard through another that some of you are a bit uncomfortable. We will struggle together to find a balance and have opportunities this fall to talk about it, listen and share. If we can join together with an attitude of love and prayer to enter fully into the transition and the new phase of our life together, we might be able to alleviate some of the stress and distress of change.

Hope's Food Tent Sets Record Sales at Hog Wild Days



This year's food tent set a record at Hog Wild Days. The tent took in \$9076.20 in sales during the four day event. Prayers were answered this year for nice weather. This year was also one of the smoothest running events in recent years. With donations and additional income from sales of leftover meat and other product we should come close to grossing a grand total of \$10,000! The previous highest record was set with \$8752.00 tent sales in 2008 and highest grand total Hog Wild Days was \$9287.75 set back in 2005.



Thanks goes out to all who helped with Hog Wild Days no matter how big or small. This year the event was led by committee members Kevin and Ruth Vial, Joe and Sarah Sherbon, and Dan and Cathy Evers. The pie group was led by Faye Cieslek, Sloppy Joes by Joyce Barrington, and the onion chopping crew was led by Lois Gladson.



Thanks also go out to Ken Shaffer for providing the cargo and flatbed trailers, Roger Gruwell for providing the liquid propane gas, and Andrew Buck for providing the golf car to shuttle back and forth food and supplies between the tent and the church. Special thanks go out to Women's Fellowship for purchasing another new refrigerator and an appliance dolly. One of the old refrigerators at the tent, that was twenty years old, pooped out and needed to be replaced on Friday morning.

Much appreciation goes to those who showed up to help with setting up and tearing down the tent at Guthridge Park.

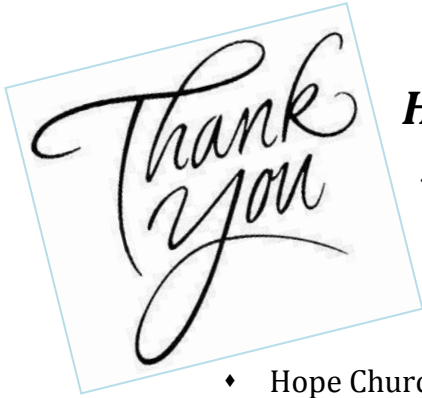
