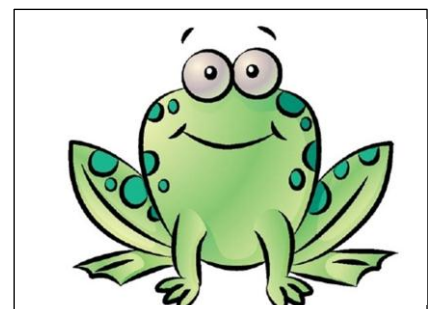

How can you light up the New Year? Can you tell me if there is an easy way to start a fire by using just two pieces of wood? The answer is simple: "It is easy to start a fire with two pieces of wood if one of those pieces of wood is a match. So how can you light up the New Year? "Be a match."

Have you ever been at a meeting and caught yourself thinking, "Why don't 'they' get down to work and do something? Where's the fire in this group?" and then complained about the meeting when you got home? Have you refused to be part of committees, boards, worship because you thought they'd be a waste of your time? Try being a match this year.

Have you ever been in a relationship where the grass looked greener elsewhere? Have you ever wished the relationship you were in was more alive, dynamic, that your love would really catch fire? Try being a match.

Have you ever wished your co-workers would exert more or less leadership or put more muscle into their efforts? Be a match.

Have you ever wondered why the community leaders weren't more concerned and the citizens more committed? Try being a match.

Have you ever watched the news and then became discouraged because our nation seemed to be making the same mistakes over and over again? Be a match.
